- WELCOME -

Welcome to **VENOUS2024**, the 36th meeting of the American Venous Forum. On behalf of the AVF Board of Directors, I would like to thank Program Chair Arjun Jayaraj, the entire Program Committee, and the AVF staff for their tremendous efforts putting together a stimulating program covering a wide range of topics with special sessions added to make this year's meeting exceptional. We are excited to be in Tampa, Florida, a culturally diverse, easily accessible, and lively city, where we look forward to presenting the best and most up-to-date advances in venous and lymphatic care and research. As the name of our society implies, it promises to be an open forum where we can discuss the key issues facing our field; listen to information on the latest clinical trials; network with colleagues and industry partners; and enjoy some relaxation and fun.

The theme of this year's meeting is The Science of Veins, a World Without Boundaries. Among the record number of abstracts received by the program committee, 40% were international, reflecting not only the growing importance and scientific impact of the AVF, but also the increasing expansion of our membership. Our International Committee has continued its outreach to make the meeting one that encompasses the globe. Indeed, the Villavicencio International Session on March 4 includes presentations from 5 different countries on three continents.

Our usual robust Scientific Sessions will be supplemented this year by the Masterclass Lecture Series given by world-renowned experts covering a broad range of topics. Each of the seven general sessions will begin with a Masterclass Lecture relevant to the session, and then progress to abstract presentations, and finally to a challenging case presentation. In addition, several new sessions appear this year, including one on Venous Health Care Inequities, an entire day of program for Advanced Practice Providers specializing in venous and lymphatic care, and a newly restructured Physician-in-Training session. As in recent years, the AVF will be sponsoring multiple physician trainees and medical students with scholarships to attend the annual meeting. There is also a first-ever community-based Day of Service, arranged with Tampa-based venous specialists, focusing on awareness of venous disease. This will take place the day prior to the start of our meeting,

Additional highlights will be special sessions including the Sumner Session, this year on Leadership Mastery; and of course the keynote Strandness Lecture to be given this year by Dr BK Lal, a past president of the AVF, who will speak on the recently organized societal-based research capabilities of the AVF, and, of course, the "Havana Nights" gala on the evening of March 5.

The New Trials and Updates session on the final day of our meeting, March 6, is truly outstanding. Our attendees will hear firsthand, and for the first time, data from trials on venous stenting, venous valve implantation, non-pneumatic compression, and an RCT on pelvic venous embolization. There will also be updates on the critically important C-TRACT Trial and study design information on upcoming venous thrombectomy trials.

Similarly to VENOUS2023, we will offer a hybrid model with both in-person and virtual options for attendance. We welcome all, but especially hope that you will be able to join us in person as we celebrate the excellent research, clinical expertise, collegiality, and camaraderie that are the hallmarks of the AVF Annual Meeting.
